The Death of Saul

1 After the death of Saul, when David had returned from the slaughter of the Amalekites, David had remained two days in Ziklag. The Lament of David

¹⁷ Then David recited this lament over Saul and Jonathan his son, ¹⁸ and he told them to teach the sons of Judah the Song of the Bow. It is written in the book of Jashar:

Your splendor, O Israel, has been slain upon your

²⁰ Do not report it in Gath,

do not announce it in the streets of Ashkelon, lest the daughters of the Philistines rejoice, or the daughters of the uncircumcised exult.

²¹ O mountains of Gilboa, may there be no rain or dew upon you or your bountiful fields: for there the shield of the mighty was defiled! The shield of Saul is no longer anointed with oil.

From the blood of the slain, from the fat of mighty, the bow of Jonathan did not turn back, nor did the sword of Saul return empty.

²³ Saul and Jonathan, beloved and delightful, neither in life nor death will they be separated. They were swifter than eagles, they were stronger than lions.

²⁴ O daughters of Israel, weep over Saul, who clothed you in scarlet and jewels, who adorned your garments with gold jewelry.


Let's choose to try to meet God's standards for each of us.

Mark 5:21-43 (NEV)

Jairus' Daughter and the Woman Who Touched

Jesus' Garment
²¹ When Jesus had crossed again by boat to the other side, many people gathered to Him. And He was beside the sea. ²² One of the rulers of the synagogue, named Jairus, saw Jesus and came and fell at His feet 23 and earnestly asked Him, "My little daughter is lying at the point of death. I ask You, come and lay Your hands on her, so that she may be healed. And she will live." ²⁴ So Jesus went with him.

And many people followed Him and pressed in on Him. ²⁵ And a certain woman had a hemorrhage for twelve years, ²⁶ and had suffered much under many physicians. She had spent all that she had, and was not better but rather grew worse. ²⁷ When she had heard of Jesus, she came in the crowd behind Him and touched His garment. ²⁸ For she said, "If I may touch His garments, I shall be healed." ²⁹ And immediately her hemorrhage dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of the affliction.


30 At once, Jesus knew within Himself that power had

35 While He was still speaking, some came from the

³⁷ He let no one follow Him, except Peter, and James, and John the brother of James. ³⁸ He came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and saw the tumult, and those who wept and wailed loudly. ³⁹ When He came in, He said to them, "Why make this uproar and weep? The girl is not dead, but sleeping." They laughed at Him in ridicule.

But when He had put them all out, He took the father and the mother of the girl and those who were with Him and entered where the girl was lying. 41 He took the girl by the hand and said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise."
