I made the recipe with what I had, and the cake tasted nice - perhaps a bit different to what I remembered, but alright.


But back to the yoghurt. In life many people try to short-change us, or to shift the goalposts, so that we have to make more effort to achieve the same results. It is a fact of modern life.

The Good Shepherd and His Sheep

10 "Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber.

² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.

³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

⁴When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice.

⁵ But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice."

¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.


The Shepherd and His Sheep
