If only <u>we</u> could so easily influence our wider community to see God, and the church, differently - not as judgemental and harsh, but as the caring, loving support which each of us has experienced.



our aims, how we intend to reach our goals and what our church will look like in the future. I look forward to discussing the possibilities with you when next we meet.

Thank you to everyone who has been attending our *Memory Lane* morning activities. I think the format is working well and we should have no problem attracting more guests from the wider community. Please encourage

your friends and neighbours to come along! We've invested in some improvements to our sound and video systems which hopefully will be up and running for our next gathering.
