The world chooses to make Christmas about purchased gifts, special foods, drinking too much alcohol and spending too much money.


When is the world going to come to terms with a God who loves us so unreservedly?


Grandma, I wonder where you keep your wings. Are they hung in your closet with the rest of your things?

John the Baptist Prepares the Way

1 The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, ² as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way" —

³ "a voice of one calling in the wilderness,

Prepare the way for the Lord,

make straight paths for him."

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie.


⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
