Do you not know?
Have you not heard?
Has it not been told you from the beginning?
Have you not understood since the earth was founded?

He sits enthroned above the circle of the earth, and its people are like grasshoppers. He stretches out the heavens like a canopy, and spreads them out like a tent to live in.

<sup>23</sup> I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.

As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and

they immediately told Jesus about her.

So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all the sick and demon-possessed.

Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come."


<sup>39</sup> So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.
