We received a letter from Nicolette Willis, City Church, thanking West Tamworth congregation for their continuous supply of food items for the hampers they distribute to those less fortunate in our community, or those who find themselves short of funds or food for some reason. Nicolette has provided a list of the most useful items, which may help you in deciding what to donate:

1 Itr UHT full cream milk, 500g sugar, 25 pkt tea bags, 50g jar of coffee, small tins of tuna or sardines, baked beans/spaghetti, canned meals, tinned fruit (all tins with ring pull lids), cup-of-noodles, cup-of-soup, pasta or rice packet meals, biscuits (salada, sao), single serve cereals or small weet-bix. Small personal items such as toothpaste and tooth brushes could also be included.

The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again.


¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."
