⁵ The king commanded Joab, Abishai and Ittai, "Be gentle with the young man Absalom for my sake." And all the troops heard the king giving orders concerning Absalom to each of the commanders.

⁶ David's army marched out of the city to fight Israel, and the battle took place in the forest of Ephraim. ⁷ There Israel's troops were routed by David's men, and the casualties that day were great—twenty thousand men. ⁸ The battle spread out over the whole countryside, and

Meg's Musings



⁴⁹ Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died.


⁵⁰ But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die.
