²⁵ She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come.

²⁶ She speaks with wisdom,

and faithful instruction is on her tongue.

²⁷ She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness.

²⁸ Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her:

"Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all."

Without a Question

Mark 9: 32 But they did not understand what He was saving and were afraid to ask him.

A common occurrence; listening but not hearing and then not asking. Without questioning, how can we fully understand? Far too many Christians, and I include myself, are afraid to ask questions. It may be that they feel they should already know the answer and they don't want to look silly. Maybe they think there is something wrong with their questions! They may feel questions indicate they are unfaithful.

"But doubt is not the opposite of faith. Faith grows in the soil of doubts and challenges. Absent doubt, we may talk of knowledge, but given that faith is 'belief in things not seen', doubt seems to be an essential ingredient." Pastor David Lose

Pastor Lose gets his congregation to write down their questions about the gospel, God, or faith, and pass them in with the offerings; teaching us that just as we give God our time, talents and money, we also give God our questions, challenges and doubts. He then crafts his next sermon around answering these questions.

Is this something we might consider trying?

³⁶ He took a little child whom he placed among them. Taking the child in his arms, he said to them,


³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me."
