The drought may not be over, but the signs are all around us that God has not forgotten us - and rain is still able to lift our spirits, refresh our gardens, and fill water tanks.


And just as God is able to supply rain, he is able to supply love, comfort and support when we are most in need of it. Blessings from Meg
