²² Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: "People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious.

²³ For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship—and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.

It was what Paul was attempting to do as he spoke to the people of Athens, and it is what Christians have been doing for the past 2,000 years.

Some, such as Paul, use words. Others choose to reach out with actions and in giving gifts, to show God's love to others. It is a joy to be able to work alongside the members of our congregation to help make God's love real to children we will never meet.
