¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!"

¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Acts 2:14-21 (NIV) Peter Addresses the Crowd

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say.

¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning!

¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: ¹⁷ "In the last days, God says,

I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.

¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

- ¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke.
- ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and
- glorious day of the Lord. ²¹ And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

Acts 2: 1 - 21

What an extraordinary experience. Flames and wind, and people suddenly able to speak in a language other than their own.

Instead of having the opportunity of being able to sit down, and take it all in, the disciples were instead confronted by a large crowd which had gathered, drawn by the sound of the wind, and a natural curiosity.

Peter acted as spokesperson. Somehow he managed to make his voice heard above the din, and got everyone's attention.

Instead of using his own words, Peter turned to scripture, and quoted from the prophet Joel.

The words are most inclusive. It speaks of men and women, old and young.

It speaks of dreams and visions and wondrous signs.

The passage from Joel seems to be saying that there is no need for fear, and that everyone can be included.

On a day so out of the ordinary, it must have been comforting to know that God is in charge, and that we can trust Him.

I thought about those flames of Pentecost, and how they seemed to bring the disciples to life.


Sometimes our faith seems like a tiny ember in need of nurture. Sometimes we are more sure of that faith, and can act more boldly. .
