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Matthew 16: 21-28 (NIV) Jesus Predicts His Death

²¹ From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

²² Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"

²³ Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

²⁴ Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.

²⁵ For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it.

²⁶ What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?



²⁷ For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what they have done.

²⁸ "Truly I tell you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."

MATTHEW 16:21-28

This reading follows immediately on Peter's declaration that Jesus is "the Messiah, the Son of the living God".

Peter must have felt like he was walking on clouds when that statement came out of his mouth, and Jesus praised him so warmly.

For Jesus to follow such an important moment with this devastating news must have made the disciples feel that they were riding a roller-coaster.

It must have seemed inconceivable to them that Jesus could simultaneously be God's Son, and also know that he would die at the hands of the priests and other religious leaders. It just didn't make sense!

Jesus followed this up by stating that becoming a follower of his was not a recipe for an easy life. Everything must have seemed upside down.

Jesus spoke about "losing" and "saving" our lives in a way that didn't make much sense then, and doesn't make much sense today either. It goes against everything that the world teaches us.

Matthew's gospel has other passages which turn worldly wisdom upside down too. The Sermon on the Mount in chapters 5-7 also discloses many sayings which overturn conventional wisdom. It speaks of turning the other cheek, and of loving our enemies.

Much of what Jesus had to say, and much of what he did, show a different way of seeing the world. Jesus had his sights fixed on what was acceptable to God, rather than what makes life easy, or comfortable, on earth.

"Taking up our cross" to follow Jesus doesn't necessarily lead to a pleasant life - it leads to challenges, to difficulties, to adventures, even to failures..... but it also leads to a life supported by Jesus, who is beside us, each and every step of the way.
