The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

²¹ Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?"

- ²² Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.
- ²³ "Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants.
- ²⁴ As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him.
- ²⁵ Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.
- ²⁶ "At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.'
- ²⁷ The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go.
- ²⁸ "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.
- ²⁹ "His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.'
- ³⁰ "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt.
- ³¹ When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.



³² "Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to.

- ³³ Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?'
- In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

Matthew 18:21–35 and Musings

This parable is one which is very clear and easy to understand.

The message is that we should forgive each other just as freely as God forgives us.

Whilst the message is very clear, it can be quite difficult to follow

Who among us has never felt unforgiving, and annoyed, when someone has wronged us?

We live in a time where road rage exists; where people can become angry enough to kill a stranger who annoys them whilst they are driving. It can be something very simple – changing lanes – and the person sees it as a personal insult which needs to be avenged. The first servant in this parable seems a bit like a road "rager".

Lindy Chamberlain-Creighton has been invited to speak at many events on forgiveness. Lindy was wrongly convicted of killing her baby Azaria, and spent time in jail. It turned her life upside down. If anyone had the "right" to feel angry, bitter and vengeful, it was Lindy.

She has described un-forgiveness as "choosing to rent space inside your head" to the person you cannot forgive. It is as though you are allowing your head, and your heart, to be so full of un-forgiveness, that there is no room left for love, for joy, or for a way forward. Some people become consumed by how another person has wronged them. That it is all that they can think about, or talk about. It can destroy their lives.

Lindy has chosen to move on, and to allow fulfillment and happiness to grow, instead of letting old wounds dominate her life. That takes courage. It becomes a choice which is consciously made at the beginning — one which she may have had to choose again and again and again — until it became ingrained.

Choosing to forgive can take courage and strength.... sometimes more strength than we feel we have. Asking God to help us through our un-forgiveness makes it possible for us to grow, and to become stronger.

It can also lead to an inner peace which only God can provide.

So forgive us our wrongs, God, forgive us as we do not deserve; forgive us against the demands of justice; And forgive our obsession that justice be done to those who have wronged us.


