- We pray for each other, especially the members of our congregation we haven't seen for some time.



Because the Psalmist can see God's perfection as he looks around him, he also asks God to work within him, making him more pure and whole.


The Psalmist doesn't feel shame, or look to others to blame for his faults. He simply becomes aware of his own imperfections when compared to God's perfection.




OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD
