Introduction to the Sermon on the Mount

5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them.

The Beatitudes

He said:

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷ Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness. for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me.

¹² Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

A Warning Against Hypocrisy

23 Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples:

- ² "The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat.
- ³ So you must be careful to do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not
- practice what they preach.

 They tie up heavy, cumbersome loads and put them on other people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move
- ⁵ "Everything they do is done for people to see: They make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long;
- ⁶ they love the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; ⁷ they love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to be called 'Rabbi' by others.
- ⁸ "But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers.
- ⁹ And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven.
- ¹⁰ Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one Instructor, the Messiah.
- ¹¹ The greatest among you will be your servant.
- ¹² For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.




The Beatitudes

1 John 3:1-3 (NIV)


3 See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.
