Mark 8:27-38:

In the opening verse of this passage from Mark we read, "And on the way...".

Jesus had left Bethsaida, and was heading towards Caesarea Philippi.

He was in the early stages of his final journey to Jerusalem.

Jesus still had many things to teach his disciples.

He also wanted to be plain with the ordinary people, and to let them know that choosing to be a follower of Jesus is not easy, or straightforward..... it may involve sacrifice and difficulties.

Jesus seems to have been letting people know, "It's crunch time. From here on, being a follower of mine will change things in your life. Think carefully."

Jesus also outlined the fact that there would also be consequences for those people who chose not to follow Jesus.

He was saying that life lived without Jesus may seem empty and hollow - it may seem that we have given up a very valuable part of ourselves - our souls - if we turn our backs on Jesus.

Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. His followers were also on the way..... on the journey of the rest of their lives. The choices which they made in relation to Jesus would be crucial.

They could put Jesus in charge of their journey, or they could choose to put themselves in charge.

It's that simple - and also the hardest choice we ever have to make.... and one which crops up again and again, as we face new situations and new opportunities.

Peter answered, "You are the Messiah."

Jesus Predicts His Death

³¹ He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

³³ But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

The Way of the Cross

Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For whoever wants to save their lif¹ will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. ³⁶ What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? ³⁷ Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?

³⁸ If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."


