Jesus could see that many of the adults in his world had lost their joy in life. They were weighed down by burdens and responsibilities; they no longer responded to life in the way that children do.



The children could accept Jesus - his every word and action - in a way which adults could not.
They could accept that Jesus was there for them, and that he loved them. The adults wanted to analyse Jesus' words and motives. They weren't ready to take Jesus at face value.

That is why Jesus said that, "whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child, will never enter it."


