Ruth and Boaz at the Threshing Floor

3 One day Ruth's mother-in-law Naomi said to her, "My daughter, I must find a home for you, where you will be well provided for.

² Now Boaz, with whose women you have worked, is a relative of ours. Tonight he will be winnowing barley on the threshing floor.

³ Wash, put on perfume, and get dressed in your best clothes. Then go down to the threshing floor, but don't let him know you are there until he has finished eating and drinking. ⁴ When he lies down, note the place where he is lying. Then go and uncover his feet and lie down. He will tell you what to do."

⁵ "I will do whatever you say," Ruth answered.

Is Jesus teaching a new form of arithmetic?

He has just witnessed wealthy people making a big deal of tipping bags of money into the Temple collection box.

Then a poor widow creeps in, and slips in two tiny coins. Jesus is full of praise for the widow.

The difference?


The widow gave all that she had, whilst others gave some of their excess.

Jesus is focussed on proportions, rather than total amounts. Jesus can see what it cost the widow to give two tiny coins, and what it cost the wealthy people to give their bags of cash.

Our world leaders are meeting in Glasgow to discuss climate change, and what they can do about it. There will be all sorts of "rubbery" figures thrown about. Dollar values, emissions, deforestation and fossil fuel targets will all be assessed and scrutinised.

Fingers will wag, and heads will be shaken. Sums will be redone, in an attempt to meet new goals.

Let's hope and pray that these leaders can see through to the real value of things, as Jesus did.

Warning Against the Teachers of the Law

³⁸ As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, ³⁹ and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at banquets.
⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for a show

They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts.

⁴² But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.

⁴³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others.


⁴⁴ They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."
