The transition to "canned" music in supermarkets and shopping malls changed that. At first, it was carols performed in very individualistic ways.


Gradually however, it has become a permanent loop of songs such as "I'm dreaming of a white Christmas", "Jingle Bells", and "Frosty the snowman".

3 In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar—when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene—² during the high-priesthood of Annas and Cajaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord. make straight paths for him.


⁵ Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth.
