This story is so easy to picture.

It follows on from Jesus teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum, and also healing people at Simons' house, after the sun went down on the Sabbath.

In between these events, Jesus had travelled around the local villages teaching and healing. This may have been the first opportunity for the people of Capernaum to hear Jesus again. The people were pushing closer and closer towards Jesus - no doubt keen to hear every word, and to be as close as possible to him. Jesus realised that they were all likely to end up in the water. He also knew that his voice would

travel better if he was on a boat, out from the

edge of the shore. It neatly solved a few

While Jesus spoke from the boat, Peter, Andrew, James and John washed the weed from their nets, and checked them for tears - all the while listening to what Jesus was saying. When the people finally turned for home, Jesus suggested that the men do a bit more fishing. They were probably very weary, having been out all night, without catching a thing.



It seems that Peter had the mindset, "Anything to humour Jesus. After all, he can definitely draw a crowd."

So they pushed out from shore a bit, and let down their nets.

Almost immediately they had snared the catch of their lives!

For Peter, and the others, it was one more sign that Jesus was someone very special - a Rabbi - and they wanted to follow him, wherever it might lead them.

They had heard Jesus teach - in the synagogue, and now out in the open. They had seen him heal people of all sorts of diseases, and had seen him turn water into wine. This man was extraordinary!

⁹ For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, ¹⁰ and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners.




