Fabulous Finds Op Shop @ Hallsville Open 9:00 to 1:00pm, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

The proceeds from the shop last week amounted to \$1013. With Peel Valley's contribution we sent \$2100 to the Lismore Uniting Church. They lost everything from the Church and associated halls, the cafe and Op shop. Their office had almost 2 meters of water. Lismore Church provides a considerable amount of food through their welfare program to those in need. All those stocks of food have been lost. When the refuge centres close in a couple of weeks that need for food will be substantial. It is their intent to use our donation to provide food vouchers to the many families in need. All donated funds to Lismore Uniting Church will be used in this way and not for restoration or other work.


