One of the lectionary readings for this week is from Amos 8.

They are simple, practical illustrations, and speak about God's understanding of his people.

In some ways, life today is far more complex. Yet, the simple precepts of right and wrong are still the same. What God asks of us hasn't changed over the centuries. In the past week, in Sri Lanka and Britain, we have seen examples of leaders who have had to resign because they have not done the right thing - they have acted corruptly, and they have lied.

The plumb-line has found them wanting, and the fruits of their behaviour are obvious to all.

In little things, and in big things, God wants all people to take his values as our own.




At the Feet of Jesus
