## Meg's Musings

Zacchaeus was a very short man, so it probably made sense for him to climb a tree so that he could see Jesus pass by.

He probably also has other reasons for keeping his distance from other people.

As a tax-co0llector, Zaccheaus would have been despised. People would have seen him as a traitor - collecting money from fellow-Jews, and handing it over to the Romans.

So people may have jostled him, and elbowed him in the ribs in a crowded situation.

But it seems that Zacchaeus was an honest tax-collector. He made a promise to Jesus that he would repay back anyone who he had cheated 4 times the amount he had unfairly taken. That's not a promise to be made lightly! People may have jumped to unfair conclusions about Zacchaeus. Maybe he wasn't the cheat which most people assumed him to be.

Sometimes we may also jump to conclusions about people we barely know, and show a lack of acceptance towards them.

Jesus was able to accept Zacchaeus, and he calls on us to accept others too.

## Jesus and Zacchaeus

**19** Jesus entered Jericho and made his way through the town.

<sup>2</sup> There was a man there named Zacchaeus. He was the chief tax collector in the region, and he had become very rich.

<sup>3</sup> He tried to get a look at Jesus, but he was too short to see over the crowd.

<sup>4</sup> So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree beside the road, for Jesus was going to pass that way.

When Jesus came by, he looked up at Zacchaeus and called him by name. "Zacchaeus!" he said. "Quick, come down! I must be a guest in your home today." <sup>6</sup> Zacchaeus quickly climbed down and took Jesus to his house in great excitement and joy.

<sup>7</sup>But the people were displeased. "He has gone to be the guest of a notorious sinner," they grumbled.

<sup>8</sup> Meanwhile, Zacchaeus stood before the Lord and said, "I will give half my wealth to the poor, Lord, and if I have cheated people on their taxes, I will give them back four times as much!"


<sup>9</sup> Jesus responded, "Salvation has come to this home today, for this man has shown himself to be a true son of Abraham.
