One candle can wipe out darkness,


One laugh can conquer gloom,

Our faith also grows in diverse and wonderful ways. For each of us, it is based on God our Father, Jesus his son, and the Holy Spirit.


We all develop a slightly different faith, and different perspectives. But we still share a Christian faith. It is important that we notice our similarities, as well as our differences.

⁵ Some of his disciples were remarking about how the temple was adorned with beautiful stones and with gifts dedicated to God. But Jesus said.

6 "As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another; every one of them will be thrown down."

⁷ "Teacher," they asked, "when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?"
