# Words from Rev Geoff

Christ is Risen.

He is Risen indeed!

While for most people Easter is over for another year, for those of us who indeed believe that God raised Jesus up from the grave we still have a further seven Sundays to celebrate and reflect on the meaning of Easter. This Sunday our Gospel reading is John 20:17-31 describes the disciples first encounter with the risen Jesus in a locked room.

They were scared and hiding out. Yet, suddenly, amid their fear and confusion, there was Jesus standing in their midst, not with angels, trumpets, or legions, but quietly. He brought only peace, and the gift of the Holy Spirit, and a commission. In fact, Jesus breathed the Spirit into them. This is John's "Pentecost", although the Spirit comes here not with wind and flame but with Jesus' own breath, the very life-force of the one raised from the dead who tells them to go out and be peace and forgiveness and love for the world.

Jesus came and lived and died and rose again that we might have peace with one another and with God. Life in all its fullness is life with each other and God. Is this not a great vision of whom we are meant to be as a human race – people who live together in unity: in joy and peace with one another?

On 28 March I visited Duri Public School with Anne Wall to share the Easter message with the students who participate in the Religion in Schools program. It was a joy to be with thirty children from kindergarten to year 6, teaching them a song on my violin and explaining that the first Easter gift was new life in Jesus not chocolate Easter eggs. I also had a lot of fun making palm crosses with the Children and their teachers. While at the school I presented the Principal Catherine Anderson with a donation of \$1000 from the Peel Valley Congregation.

### 1 John 1:1-1 John 2:2 (NLT) Introduction

**1** We proclaim to you the one who existed from the beginning, whom we have heard and seen. We saw him with our own eyes and touched him with our own hands. He is the Word of life.

<sup>2</sup> This one who is life itself was revealed to us, and we have seen him. And now we testify and proclaim to you that he is the one who is eternal life. He was with the Father, and then he was revealed to us. <sup>3</sup> We proclaim to you what we ourselves have actually seen and heard so that you may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his

Son, Jesus Christ.

<sup>4</sup>We are writing these things so that you may fully share our joy.

## Living in the Light

<sup>5</sup> This is the message we heard from Jesus and now declare to you: God is light, and there is no darkness in him at all.

<sup>6</sup> So we are lying if we say we have fellowship with God but go on living in spiritual darkness; we are not practicing the truth.

<sup>7</sup> But if we are living in the light, as God is in the light, then we have fellowship with each other, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, cleanses us from all sin.

<sup>8</sup> If we claim we have no sin, we are only fooling ourselves and not living in the truth.

<sup>9</sup> But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all wickedness.

<sup>10</sup> If we claim we have not sinned, we are calling God a liar and showing that his word has no place in our hearts.

**2** My dear children, I am writing this to you so that you will not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate who pleads our case before the Father. He is Jesus Christ, the one who is truly righteous.

<sup>2</sup> He himself is the sacrifice that atones for our sins—and not only our sins but the sins of all the world. We are told to let our light shine, and if it does, we won't need to tell anybody it does. Lighthouses don't fire cannons to call attention to their shining—they just shine. ~ Dwight L. Moody


