Jesus Calms the Storm

35 As evening came, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let's cross to the other side of the lake."

³⁶ So they took Jesus in the boat and started out, leaving the crowds behind (although other boats followed).

³⁷ But soon a fierce storm came up. High waves were breaking into the boat, and it began to fill with water.

Jesus was sleeping at the back of the boat with his head on a cushion. The disciples woke him up, shouting, "Teacher, don't you care that we're going to drown?"

39 When Jesus woke up, he rebuked the

wind and said to the waves, "Silence! Be still!" Suddenly the wind stopped, and there was a great calm.

⁴⁰ Then he asked them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

⁴¹ The disciples were absolutely terrified. "Who is this man?" they asked each other. "Even the wind and waves obey him!"

Words from Rev Geoff

Let Jesus calm the storm in your life. This Sunday we read the story of the storm found in Mark 4:35-41. Jesus is just as present in the crashing waves as he is in the still waters of the Sea of Galilee. At no time in the night is he absent or distant from his disciples. Jesus rests in the midst of his disciples, rocked as they are rocked, soaked as they are soaked.

This observation invites us as individuals and a Church to seek the grace of experiencing God's presence in the storm. The grace to know that we are accompanied by the divine in the most miserable most dangerous places. The grace to trust that Jesus cares even when we are drowning. The grace to believe in both the existence and the power of love even when Jesus "sleeps." Even when the miraculous calm doesn't come.

Note also that Jesus waits until after the storm has blown itself out before he invites his disciples to reflect, "Why are you afraid?" Is it an accusation that implies they ought not to have been afraid or is it an invitation to pause and learn from the experience? Why are we afraid as Christians? What false assumptions do we hold about the character of God? What damaging lessons have we learned about the relationship between chaos and care that we need to discard? Are we more interested in God being with us, or God doing things for us?

It is only after the storm has passed that the disciples ask the most important question of all: "Who is this man?", Who is the person who sleeps through storms, accepts our accusations, and offers us his quiet, mysterious presence in scary places? Could he indeed be the God who loves us in the chaos?

In her book Any Ordinary Day, Leigh Sales provides *numerous stories where* suffering and evil doesn't lead to a loss of faith. The tragedy of random events can draw people to faith. They seek the good because they *have experienced the bad*. They yearn for justice because injustice surrounds them. They pray for calm because chaos brings them to their knees.

It's after the life-threatening storm that the disciples recognize the holy in their midst. It's after the boat fills with water that they are "filled with a great awe." It's after Jesus accompanies them in the chaos that they realize who he is. May the same be true of us.



So I picked up my carrot and wandered down. It worked so well, people started smiling when they saw me and the carrot and I think it helped calm them down.

I try to get out as often as possible but you have to be in the mood to do something like this... today I've been out here for about an hour and a half and I've had hundreds and hundreds of smiles. This is what's so good about it, if I want to do something good I just grab the carrot and head on out.






Peace! Be Still!
