Words from Rev Geoff - Be Imitators of Christ

This week I am attending the Saltbush Spring Retreat for Rural Minister's which is being held at the St Joseph's Catholic retreat Centre in Kincumber, I valued this opportunity to withdraw from the weekly routine of ministry to focus more intentionally on my own spiritual journey as an imitator of Christ. Our call to action in this Sunday's Epistle reading is to "be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love as Christ loved us" (Ephesians 5:1) This word translated as "imitators" or "followers" comes from the same Greek word as the word mimic. It has the positive connotation of emulating a pattern set by an admired role model, and it is used seven times in the New Testament to advocate following or emulating certain early church leaders, Christ, and, ultimately, God.

We are to imitate Christ and model our lives after him. in the same way as a child imitates their parents. It's how children learn everything from washing their hands to putting away toys to treating others with respect. Young children want to grow up to be like their parents, and they will often pretend to be their parents—trying on their parents' shoes, wearing their hats or baptising their dolls if their parent is a Minister. Mimicking your parents is an important part of childhood play.

For over 500 years. The Imitation of Christ by Thomas A Kempsis was the classic devotional textbook to encourage Christians to lead deep spiritual lives characterised by holiness, simplicity and humility. I was given a copy by my field education supervisor, and I often turn to it when I am feeling spiritually dry. Thomas reacts strongly to Christians who claimed superior authority and biblical knowledge but lacked an intimate relationship with Jesus. For Thomas a certain amount of withdrawing from the world is essential if we are to cultivate the spiritual life.

His message of unworldliness, withdrawal and humility seem almost counter cultural today as so much of our social media is about self-promotion and having the most followers. Yet if we are to find peace in this time of political and social then perhaps, we need to rediscover the great spiritual classics such a the imitation of Christ Revered as a way of relearn to walk in love, give sacrificially to others and offering ourselves fully as a child of God.

named Smoky

served in combat

during WWII?

In 1944 Smoky was found in a foxhole in the jungles of New Guinea by an American soldier who brought her back to camp and sold her to Corporal William A. Wynne for \$6.44.

For the next 2 years Smoky lived a soldier's life. Because she was not an official military dog, she did not get dog food or medical care. She shared Wynne's meals and slept beside him in his tent.

The little dog even flew 12 air/sea rescue and photo reconnaissance missions, secured in the soldiers backpack. She survived 150 air raids and saved Wynne by warning him of incoming shells. Like many Yorkies, Smoky also loved to learn tricks and perform. She did so with the Special Services - entertaining soldiers in hospitals. After the war Smoky was flown back to the US hidden in a oxygen mask carrying case.

For the next 10 years she made television and public appearances in Veterans hospitals until her death in 1957.


