¹⁷ He went down with them and stood on a level place. A large crowd of his disciples was there and a great number of people from all over Judea, from Jerusalem, and from the coastal region around Tyre and Sidon,

Bulletin. I am deeply moved by the song 'Thank you Lord for your blessings on me' – a Bill Gaither special where the last line for both verses sing 'thank you Lord for your blessings on me'. In the second verse looks at a person who, perhaps, is isn't financially wealthy and doesn't have 'new clothes', yet is so dependent on God's provision, care and love. And that is the truest blessing of all.

Luke's recounting of the sermon on the mount is challenging for readers of any generation. Jesus flips the script and challenges our idea of what our understanding regarding 'blessed' might look like. I confess that sometimes my understanding of what being 'blessed' looks like is somewhat influenced by the secular world. The teachings. elsewhere called the Beatitudes, turns prevailing ideas about what it means to be blessed upside down. Where is there blessedness in deep poverty, or hunger or being hated? I wonder how blessed did you feel in the terrible drought or going for so many years without Ministers? Is this passage all future oriented – a promise for an afterlife or is there something more profound operating here. There is certainly some eschatological feature at play, but the greater reality is that when we are dependent on God for our lives, whether we are poor, hungry or hated. the sustenance we experience is, in itself, miraculous. Total dependence on the grace of God is the hallmark of Jesus' life and ministry. We are invited into just such a life.

Basic Will-making services start from \$462. These documents are FREE for those eligible for a full Centrelink Age Pension.


