We continue to sit with those gathered on the level place as we hear Christ continue to speak about the hardest thing, we as people struggle with – 'loving our enemies'. The truth is, it is easy to say, but when put into action, it is the hardest thing yet; because the reality is that we only love those who love us which is fine, but Christ invites us to love those who have wronged us – our 'enemies'. Again, Christ challenges our view this time with how we love: with how we show mercy when it is the hardest to do.

I wonder if there has ever been a time when we could say, "The world is at peace"? Jesus may well say we should love our enemies, be kind to those who hate us and turn the other cheek, but where do we see these all being lived out?

Instead, we see the starving and broken bodies of voung children - the victims of war. We hear racist chants decrying the rights of refugees and belittling those who are different. The daunting thought is that the hostility and hatred that gives rise to war, terrorism and bigotry can just as easily reside in our hearts if we are not vigilant.

Humankind has such a propensity for anger and division that it is frightening. Humankind also has such a propensity for love and kindness that it can be inspiring. We can be moved to act with generosity and compassion, but it takes the orientation of our lives to these values in a deliberate fashion. For Christians, it is our relationship with God in Christ that lays the foundation for the common good. It is through prayer and the study of the scripture that we can come closer to the ways of God.

After we finished eating, I went again to the back of the plane, heading for the rest room. A man stopped me. "I saw what you did. I want to be part of it." He handed me \$25. As I returned to my seat, I saw the Flight Captain coming down the aisle, looking at the aisle numbers as he walked. When he got to my row he stopped, smiled, held out his hand and said, "I want to shake your hand." Quickly unfastening my seat belt I stood and

Once, someone bought me a lunch. It was an act of kindness I never forgot." I was embarrassed when applause was heard from all of the passengers.

When we landed I gathered my belongings and started to deplane. Waiting just inside the airplane door was a man who stopped me, put something in my shirt pocket, turned, and walked away without saying a word. Another \$25!

Entering the terminal, I saw the soldiers gathering for their trip to the base. I walked over to them and handed them \$75, explaining who it came from.

"It will take you some time to reach the base. It will be about time for a sandwich. God Bless You."

Ten young men left that flight feeling the love and respect of their fellow travelers. As I walked briskly to my car, I whispered a prayer for their safe return. These soldiers were giving their all for our country. I could only give them a couple of meals. It seemed so little. ~ faithhub.net






The Golden Rule
