Acts 11:1-18 (NLT) Peter Explains His Actions

11 Soon the news reached the apostles and other believers in Judea that the Gentiles had received the word of God.

² But when Peter arrived back in Jerusalem, the Jewish believers criticized him.

³ "You entered the home of Gentile and even ate with them!" they said.

⁴ Then Peter told them exactly what had happened.

⁵ "I was in the town of Joppa," he said, "and while I was praying, I went into a trance and saw a vision. Something like a large sheet was let down by its four corners from the sky. And it came right down to me.

⁶ When I looked inside the sheet, I saw all sorts of tame and wild animals, reptiles, and birds.

⁷ And I heard a voice say, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat them.'

⁸ "'No, Lord,' I replied. 'I have never eaten anything that our Jewish laws have declared impure or unclean.'

⁹ "But the voice from heaven spoke again: 'Do not call something unclean if God has made it clean.'

¹⁰ This happened three times before the sheet and all it contained was pulled back up to heaven.

¹¹ "Just then three men who had been sent from Caesarea arrived at the house where we were staying.

¹² The Holy Spirit told me to go with them and not to worry that they were Gentiles. These six brothers here accompanied me, and we soon entered the home of the man who had sent for us.

¹⁷ And since God gave these Gentiles the same gift he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to stand in God's way?"

¹⁸When the others heard this, they stopped objecting and began praising God. They said, "We can see that God has also given the Gentiles the privilege of repenting of their sins and receiving eternal life."

³¹ As soon as Judas left the room, Jesus said, "The time has come for the Son of Man to enter into his glory, and God will be glorified because of him.

³⁴ So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.

³⁵ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

Minister's Weekly Reflection

Love One Another – That's an Order If you knew you were about to die, what would you tell the people you love? What hope or prayer for the future would you share? What last, urgent piece of advice would you offer?

In John 13, our Gospel reading for this week, we hear Jesus' answer to this challenging question. Judas has left the Last Supper and is on his way to betray Jesus, the clock is ticking, and Jesus knows that his death is imminent. Jesus is concerned that his disciples are about to experience a major grief and so he gets right to the point. No parables, stories, or syrupy clichés just a single straightforward commandment which summarizes Jesus' deepest yearning for his closest companions:

"Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

Jesus then immediately offers a promise. Or is it an incentive or perhaps even a warning?

"By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Take a moment to consider what Jesus didn't say as his parting words of advice. He doesn't say, "Believe the right things." or "teach the right things" He doesn't say, "Worship this way" or "go to church this often".

He doesn't even say, "Read your Bible," or "Pray every day," or "Preach the Gospel to every living person." Jesus reduces the essence of Christianity down to three words.

"Love one another."

That's it, a command so simple that it could easily be memorised by a preschooler and yet so weighty that even the most mature Christian will be embarrassed by how poorly they understand it and put it into practice. All of Christianity distilled down to its essence so that maybe we'll pause long enough to hear it.

Love one another.

Jesus' commandment to us is not that we should exhaust ourselves, trying to manufacture love from our own easily depleted resources. It invites us to dwell in the sacred source of all love. We can make our home in Jesus' love— the most abundant and inexhaustible love in existence. Then our love is not our own because it reflects God's love for us, a love that is unlimited unconditional and universal.

"Love one another as I have loved you."

And so they did. Together. Always.




