

Seasons of the Spirit

Faith Is...

Readings

Isaiah 1:1, 10–20; Psalm 50:1–8, 22–23; Hebrews 11:1–3, 8–16; Luke 12:32–40

Prayer

Great is your faithfulness, eternal God. Empower us to live with confidence and conviction, as did our ancestors in the faith. Amen.

Reflection

As God calls us to claim our roles as disciples, our response is grounded in faith. What is this faith? In the readings today, we encounter the dynamic nature of faith and its expression in the lives of individuals and communities. We live in the assurance of faith as we await the fullness of the reign of God.

Biblical Background

Isaiah 1:1, 10–20 The people are called upon to participate in the coming of God's reign. They are called to "learn to do good, seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow" (v. 17). These are the keys to their being able to "eat the good of the land." The faith being described in Isaiah is not just personal experience; it is a community response as well. We work together in bringing the promises of God's realm to pass.

Faithfulness is not merely a matter of ritual or going through proper motions of worship. As Psalm 50:1–8, 22–23 proclaims, we are called to discern what is faithful and true in a relationship with God, giving thanks and going "the right way."

Jesus calls us to lives of faithfulness, being ever ready to participate in the reign of God. The teaching of Jesus in Luke 12:32–40 looks ahead to this new realm of God, urging us to prepare to eat at God's heavenly banquet table. Those who are prepared are willing to trust God to lead them into the future, just as Sarah and Abraham were. They are to "give alms" to care for those in need, just as Isaiah had said was necessary. 

Hebrews 11:1–3, 8–16 "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (v. 1). Led by our ancestors and mentors in the faith, we are called to trust that God will provide. But so much about our world challenges the biblical images of God's reign where justice and mercy prevail. This week, we are encouraged again to look to the example of faithful witnesses for the assurance we need to keep hoping and believing.

In verses 8–16, the writer lifts up Abraham and Sarah as people who had faith even when indications of the fulfillment of God's promises were unseen. God called Abraham when he was 75 years old and made particular promises to Abraham and his wife Sarah (Genesis 12:1–3).

Through this aged, childless couple, a great nation would arise, which would bless all people of Earth. Moreover, God would bring Sarah and Abraham to a new land, but they would need to leave their home and rely on God to lead them to this unknown place.

Although "very rich in livestock, in silver, and in gold" (Genesis 13:2), Abraham and Sarah did not find security in possessions or land. They set off in faith. The theme of "home" is echoed by the writer of Hebrews, though in this biblical witness "home" is not land but "a better country," – "a heavenly one."

According to Genesis, our ancestors did have doubts – serious doubts, especially concerning the promise of descendants – yet they trusted God to fulfill promises, even though they would not live to see the full fruition of God's providing. The writer of Hebrews encourages us to respond in faith to God's promises and calling on our lives, just as Sarah and Abraham did.

Faith in things unseen is active, not a passive waiting.

Questions

These scripture passages all emphasize the importance of trusting God's promises and actively discerning the ways of God. We give thanks for our ancestors in faith who continue to lead the way. What does it mean to live as faithful people, here and now? What does your vision of God's promised reign call you to do and be, by faith?
