

About the Season after Epiphany 2020...

Dec 29, 2019 Christmas 1 "Choose Praise" Psalm 148 After the demands leading up to Christmas day, this week offers an opportunity to join with creation in joyous praise and rest in the amazement that God is with us.

Jan 5, 2020 Christmas 2/Epiphany "Choose Hope". Matthew 2:1-12 At the close of the Christmas season, Epiphany beckons each of us to embrace the hope in the gift of the Christ.

About the art

My grandmother Etoile was my grandfather's "star" and his first and last day of life was on January 6. Each were lights for me, guides along the journey that pointed toward living a good, Christian life. They grounded me to the earth as we tended gardens, cut flowers, and often took them to the altar at church each week.

Each of us has a cloud of witnesses we look to, that both point us forward and draw us home. I'm most at home when I am outdoors, and especially when I gaze up at the night sky, seeing the stars that surround us day and night. Seeing the vastness of the universe above, I feel connected to the Creator and Maker of all. When creating this artwork, I was thinking about the way that light connects us all and, in the process, made a "starburst" from the light pouring into creation. The hues are more muted with tones of the sky and metallic paints. The movement of the leaves and vines provides a movement for emotion. The peacock feather found its way into the piece, with presence and boldness. The star guides our attention into the centre and also away from itself, following the "bursts" that surround it. We, too, have our attention centred on Christ and focused in many directions beyond ourselves. Our faith calls us to care for ourselves, to seek direction, focus, and forgiveness, and to return to the world with a call to serve, to share, and to be the light.
