Advent Study 2



Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, ² as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"— 3 "a voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'"

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In the passage set for this week 2 of Advent we have God under going some preparation that has been on the drawing board for almost 600 years. The author of Mark's Gospel quotes the prophecy of Isaiah 40:3 who foretold of a messenger who would prepare the way of the Lord, words of comfort for the people of God who were living under the dark storm clouds of being taken out of their promised land into exile in Babylon. These words reveal that God has a plan and that His plans and preparations are coming into play.

As a young fella, I used to suffer terribly from travel sickness. So when our family visited with my mum's family who lived on a citrus orchard at

Tuggerah on the Central Coast, it was with considerable trepidation that I got into the car for the 80 mile journey from Sydney to Tuggerah up the old winding Pacific Highway, long before the initial short tollway was constructed and the M1 was still a dream. Oh how I wished the paths had been made straight and the hills and valleys leveled.

I don't think God, the prophet Isaiah or John the Baptist who spoke those words so long ago, was talking about actual highway construction, but about

a preparation of mind, heart and emotions to be in tune with a new thing God was about to do. That new thing was God's return to be with His people of Israel.



Mark and Matthew both identify John the Baptist as the voice from Isaiah 40:3. In the Gospel of John, the Baptizer himself says he is that voice (John 1:23).

John the Baptist is the foretold messenger, who just happens to also be Jesus cousin. He has the task of preparing the way for the commencement of Jesus ministry. Making the valleys rise up and the mountains and hills low and the rough ground shall become level and the rugged places a plain (Isa 30:4). John is to remove obstacles in people's lives in preparation for the beginning of Jesus ministry.

Based on this pattern of calling for "leveling and straightening" in areas specific to one's opportunities, resources, and roles, we can assume that if John were addressing us, he'd tailor his directives to the actual circumstances of our lives as well, so that the highway for Christ to come to us is unobstructed. This is not to suggest that we build our own highway to Christ—that is the work of God, but we can often force him to travel some significantly bumpy, potholed, and difficult ways along the road to us.

For example, some of the hills and valleys on our spiritual road can be such things as a lack of generosity; failure to love our neighbours as we love

ourselves; a failure to love ourselves!, behaviours that don't align with God's expectations of His people; blindness to the needs of those around us; silence when our Christian testimony would help others in their spiritual journey; unchecked anger; failure to follow through on promises; sins of omission; halfhearted commitments; belittling remarks to loved ones; and so on. With a little



thought, most of us can come up with our own list of places where we need to do some leveling and straightening as we prepare this Advent season. John the Baptist tells us v8, "that he baptizes with water, but the coming one will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." This brings to mind Galatians 5:22-23 that talks of the fruit of the Spirit that we receive as Christ comes into our lives. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law."

Some Questions to Conder


- What kinds of leveling and straightening do you need to do? What 1. obstacles to your full discipleship need to be addressed prayerfully with God?

Do you find it reassuring that God's plans are continuing to be fulfilled?


