## Lenten Reflection

## 1st Sunday in Lent 2018

There is no better way to start Lent than by getting to know Jesus better by reading his life story.

Through Lent, we will be taking a journey with Jesus from the River Jordan, where he was baptised, to the city of Jerusalem, where he was crucified and buried, and where he rose from the dead. The events happened 2,000 years ago, but you can still visit the places Jesus lived.

You can read the short Bible sections or if you prefer, you can read the whole chapters in Mark's Gospel to put the story into context.

### Read: Mark chapters 1–3

Key verses:

'At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee. John baptized Jesus in the Jordan River. Jesus was coming up out of the water. Just then he saw heaven being torn open. Jesus saw the Holy Spirit coming down on him like a dove. A voice spoke to him from heaven. It said, "You are my Son, and I love you. I am very pleased with you."

At once the Holy Spirit sent Jesus out into the desert. He was in the desert 40 days. There Satan tempted him. The wild animals didn't harm Jesus. Angels took care of him.' Mark 1:9–13

In the first chapters of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' identity is being established. We see God fleshed out as a man who is tempted, just like we are tempted, but who doesn't sin.

#### Some questions to ponder on:

Our relationships help to shape the people we become. Which relationships have shaped you for the better?

Looking at the description of Jesus' baptism, how would you describe Jesus' relationship with his Father in heaven?


