



Seasons of the Spirit Compassionate Neighbours

Readings

Amos 7:7–17; Psalm 82; Colossians 1:1–14; and Luke 10:25–37.

Prayer

O God of justice and mercy, implant within us hearts of faithfulness, hearts that lead our handsin works of compassion. From your great love for us, inspire us to love our neighbours, that all might come to know your plan for our world. Amen.

Reflection

This week's readings invite us to consider how love and compassion are the essences of living faithfully. They call us to shape our lives according to God's justice and mercy, striving for relationships that enable community. God's word has ultimate authority and responding to God's call for justice and compassion is everything.

Biblical Background

Amos 7:7–17 The priest of Bethel, presumably with the authority of the king, attempts to persuade Amos to take his prophecy of destruction to some other place. Amos, however, has no regard for those in positions of human authority and prestige who ignore God. Status is nothing; responding to God with faithfulness is everything. Picking up on the idea of compassion for others, Psalm 82 emphasizes how God cares for and defends the disadvantaged or those in need.

God's most essential concern is with justice and compassion.

Luke 10:25–37 The gospel of Luke emphasizes that people on the edges of the society in which the gospel was written – the outcasts, the lonely, the sick, women, children – are included in God's reign. Indeed, the reign of God is open to all who know the love of God and respond to it.

To make this point, the gospel writer chooses subversive stories such as this one, the one often referred to as The Good Samaritan.

Here, Jesus criticizes religious leaders. Some readers today might imply





that these leaders were putting purity laws and temple practices above the call of the law to love God and neighbour, but the text doesn't tell us why these individuals did not stop and help.


The writer of the gospel of Luke portrays Jesus as a prophet. In the Hebrew Scriptures, the prophets were continually calling leaders and those who maintain structures of power to turn from religious distortions back to the heart of faithfulness – justice, love, mercy, and compassion.

In this story, Jesus issues the prophetic call through an unlikely character – a Samaritan. In doing so, Jesus challenges national stereotypes held by both the Jewish and Samaritan peoples. Both the Jews and the Samaritans followed practices and beliefs of Judaism as defined in the Hebrew Scriptures. However, the Jews centred their faith lives in the temple at Jerusalem, and the Samaritans focused theirs at Mount Gerizim. There were deep, historical rifts between these two groups. The Jewish audience of this gospel would have considered the Samaritans to be unclean. Yet in this story, the Samaritan is the one who responds most faithfully.

The gospel of justice and compassion is bearing fruit and growing in the members of the church in the city of Colossae. In Colossians 1:1–14, the author describes the world as a place of shadows and of light. The Colossian believers have been brought from the shadows into light by God's grace. It is that grace growing in their lives that produces the fruit of good works and wisdom that is a "marker of the community."

Questions

We are called to live into the reign of God, where every human being is treated with love and justice. As compassionate disciples, we love God with all our hearts and our neighbours as ourselves. What acts of justice and kindness – given and received – have accompanied your faith journey? In what ways do members of your church strive for relationships that enable community to flourish?
