

Seasons of the Spirit Into the Land of Faith

Focus scripture

John 6:1-21, 2 Samuel 11:1-15, Psalm 14and Ephesians 3:14-21.

Prayer

Take a quiet moment to pray St. Patrick's Breastplate:

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me. Christ to comfort me and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend or stranger.

Introduction

It is easy to spend time focusing on the miracles that are the headline stories of today's gospel reading, but perhaps in doing so we miss an important revelation. Today's focus reading invites us to examine, once again, who the person of Jesus was and what he revealed about the reign of God, its welcome, generosity, and dependability as we journey further into the land of faith.

Focus scripture: John 6:1-21

The feeding of the five thousand reminds us that God is generous beyond measure, and the story of Jesus walking on water has us wonder about Jesus' connection with and understanding of his oneness with all creation. Both stories invite us to stop and to think deeply as we ask, "Who is this Jesus?" The gospel writer has cleverly opened up the opportunity to move on to answer this question in the "I am sayings," I am the ...bread of life (6:35), ...light of the world (8:12), ...good shepherd (10:11), ...resurrection and the life(11:25), ...way, truth and life (14:6),....true vine (15:1).

Biblical scholar, William Loader, writes: "John consistently takes stories from the tradition about Jesus and moulds them so that they now make statements about who Jesus is for us. Using images of daily necessity, like bread, water, light, life, which were earlier used of Torah, God's Law, John is declaring that our deepest needs are to be found in him" ("First Thoughts on



It is important not to overlook that Jesus hears the murmurings of the crowd as they begin to realize that Jesus is "the prophet who is come into

the world," and their desire to make him king. This is not what Jesus wants; this is not his purpose, so he leaves. Those who follow because of the signs rather than that which is behind and beyond the miracles are cautioned. Those who only see this dimension of Jesus don't fully see who he is. Foolishness is part of the human condition, and today's Hebrew scriptures highlight that this was ever the case.



David makes foolish and selfish decisions in **2 Samuel 11:1–15** as he abandons God's way.

Many pay the price – Uriah, Bathsheba, David himself, all the people that he has been called to lead. In **Psalm 14**, the writer laments those who act as if God does not exist. What we see in both readings is that God is ever faithful; God does not abandon David, and the psalmist reassures us that God's offer of restoration is always available, even to fools.

This is also the message of grace that is written in the beautiful prayer to the Church in Ephesus in **Ephesians 3:14–21**. The writer prays that the Ephesians may know "the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge" – for this is enough.

As we travel the road of faith, we are not sheltered from the vulnerabilities of "normal" life, we come across the breadth and depth of human experience. Perhaps it is how we live through the journey of our lives that speaks loudest about who we are, what we believe and who travels with us. What do the people who are looking on at our journey see? Do they see us as companions of Christ? Do they see us moving toward the peaceable reign of God's promises? What of God's reign do they experience? Do they see us as being grounded in love?
