Seasons of the Spirit Deep Down Questions

Readings

1 Kings 19:1–4, (5–7), 8–15a; Psalm 42 and 43; Galatians 3:23–29 and Luke 8:26-39

Prayer

God our rock, storms rage around us and we despair. Come to us in the silence; nourish and strengthen us for the journey to which you call us. We praise you, our help and our God. Amen.

Reflection

This week's readings invite us to turn our whole selves - body, mind, and spirit – toward God, who envelops us in grace. God nourishes and sustains us and reaches out to us in the depths of our despair or aloneness. There are challenges in being faithful; God delights in each one of us and supports us as we journey in God's presence.

Biblical Background

1 Kings 19:1–4, (5–7), 8–15a This week introduces the prophet Elijah who is in conflict with the prophets of the rain god, Baal. A drought holds Israel in its grip, and Baal is not able to bring relief. Elijah and Baal's prophets hold a public test of strength. During this contest, the prophets of Baal are killed.

King Ahab and his wife, Jezebel, hold Elijah responsible, and Jezebel threatens to destroy him. The prophet flees to the southern kingdom of Judah and beyond, into the desert.

Elijah has had enough. In despair, the prophet prays to God that he may die. God's angel feeds Elijah twice, encouraging him to sleep and eat to be strengthened for the journey. Elijah travels 40 days and nights to Horeb (Sinai), the mountain where God gave Israel the law and the covenant. Elijah returns to the place where Moses encountered God, and God is with Elijah on the journey.

God asks Elijah, "What are you doing here?" Elijah pours out his frustrations. "I've tried my best. I am the only one of your prophets left. Now they want to kill me." In the midst of Elijah's time of deep down questioning, God is present.

As Elijah watches from the cave, there is great rock-splitting wind, an





earthquake, and fire. But Elijah does not find God in any of these. God's presence is experienced in what the original Hebrew describes as "the sound of fine silence." Elijah covers his face in awe at this experience. God asks the question again, "Elijah, what are you doing here?" Elijah replies in the same words, but this time we can imagine a tone of acceptance of the responsibility God has given him. "Go," God says, "return." God tells Elijah to take up the work again. When Elijah was in despair, God pursued. God strengthened Elijah for the work to which he was called.

God is present in our times of despair when we are ready to give up. God calls and sustains us in our ministry.

We, for our part, are encouraged to listen in the fine silence.

Psalms 42 and 43 could be Elijah's prayer. Where is God? Has God forgotten me? These are the "deep down questions" that troubled Elijah and the psalmist. They are questions that trouble us. But God is a rock. We can hope and trust in God.

As in the Elijah story, the gospel reading shows God as having power over nature and human life. In Luke 8:26–39, Jesus visits a gentile region and meets a person overcome by demons. On the way there, Jesus has calmed the lake storm. Now he calms this troubled one. The man is quieted, and God's love proclaimed in the silence. The man would like to go with Jesus, but Jesus sends him to take up his discipleship in everyday life.

Paul is responding to challenging questions in Galatians 3:23–39, answering those who say gentile converts must keep all the demands of the Jewish law. Paul argues that, by baptism, we are all children of God through faith and heirs of the promise to Abraham. There is no distinction between Jew and Gentile. All are one in Christ.

Questians

There are times when life overwhelms us, and we despair.

What questions come to us in such "deep down" moments?

God nourishes and sustains us when we allow quiet moments in God's presence to heal and restore us. God sends us back to continue our discipleship in our daily lives. In God's love, we find truth, promise, and hope.
