Seasons of the Spirit Set Up and So...

Readings

Jeremiah 29:1, 4–7, Psalm 66:1–12, 2 Timothy 2:8–15 and Luke 17:11–19.

Prayer

O God, you are the God who moves. You move over the waters of chaos and bring creation. You move ahead of us on our journeys through the wildernesses of life. You moved into the flesh, and you came to those of us others avoided. May you move in our hearts as well. Move us toward compassion. Move us toward peace. Move us toward thanksgiving. Amen.

Reflection

An emerging theme of the second half of the Pentecost season is the call to live now the promise of God's future realities. Perhaps this is no surprise in a year when we read from the gospel of Luke, a book filled with the work of justice and with calls to live and proclaim such. The readings this week bring God's reality into the lives of the marginalized, as an inbreaking of justice for those who have been cast out of their community.

Biblical Background

Jeremiah 29:1, 4–7 the prophet envisions the restoration of community. The Judean people are in exile in Babylon, but it is there, away from the place they would have called "home," that the prophet proclaims the word of God to be a word of the re-establishment of community. The people are to settle themselves and to invest in the place they have landed for the long haul. They are to attend to one another's needs. They are to break bread. They are to build families. A vital component of the establishment of community in this passage is also the establishment of hope.

Psalm 66:1–12 Invoking the Israelites' particular liberation narrative, the Exodus, and the broad embrace of God, the writer reminds that the times of trouble, trial, and testing are never far away. There is a constant need to reorient one's life and the life of the community toward thanksgiving if we are to live as people who are truly free from bondage.

Luke 17:11–19 "When Jesus saw them, he said, 'Go...'" (Luke 17:14). Though this is a shortened version of this command, we too find ourselves called to go. But where are we to go? And what are we to go and do? In this story in the gospel of Luke, Jesus is approached by ten people with

skin diseases as he travels to Jerusalem. They beg for him to show them mercy. Mercy was something they probably found in short supply in their lives, as people with skin diseases were typically excluded from their communities (Lev 13:46). The text even notes that as they cry out to Jesus, they keep their distance (17:12). Society's rules have been ingrained into them, and these ten with skin diseases act accordingly.

As he is apt to do, Jesus hears the pleas for mercy. He commands them to present themselves before the priests (17:14). In order to be restored to the communities from which their diseases have cast them, these people must be declared free of any infliction by a priest. They abide and are healed as they go seek restoration.

But one of the healed returns to Jesus. He prostrates himself and gives thanks. It is only then that the text mentions this one person happens to be a Samaritan. This is interesting and bears further exploration for two reasons. Earlier in the gospel of Luke, Samaritans had been unkind to Jesus by refusing to welcome him into their villages (9:53). But now a Samaritan is the example of offering humility and thanksgiving before God. It is of interest to note that the ethnic indication of "Samaritan" only comes after the person has been healed. While inflicted and therefore exiled, ethnicity means little to this group of ten.

For both the healed who go to present themselves to the priests and for the Samaritan who returns to Jesus, the command to go is a command to be part of the community and to be restored.

The author of 2 Timothy 2:8–15 finds himself in a similar predicament to those in the passage from Jeremiah. This person finds himself imprisoned (2:9). But prison cannot confine or keep out the reaches of community. The author notes earlier in the book that he has found support from Onesiphorus in spite of his imprisonment (1:16). Noting that strength that can be derived from the community, the individual, and the relationship the early church had with Christ, the author leans on communal words, drawing from what was probably part of a hymn or creed in the early church. "If we have died together, we will also live together" (2:11b, Common English Bible) and "if we are disloyal, he stays faithful" (2:13a).

Questions

Where are we to go? What are we to go and do? Today's scriptures remind us that our call to go and to build community is grounded in the love of God which heals, nurtures, builds up and is eternally faithful.
