### **Soothing our Souls**

#### **Focus scripture**

Exodus 32:1–14; Psalm 106:1–6, 19–23; Philippians 4:1–9; Matthew 22:1 –14;

### Prayer

Draw closer to us, God of the journey, for sometimes in our zeal to do what is right, we trespass against you, and lose our way; leaving us longing for your soothing words of comfort and challenge. Amen.

The people have grown impatient (and perhaps scared) searching for comfort in false gods. When have we in our need for an immediate response turned to false gods, attempting to replace the God of forever for the gods of right now?

#### Reflection: Exodus 32:1-14

In Exodus 20, we read that Moses received from God the commandments that were to give order and value to the life of the Hebrew people. Chapters 21–31 comprise further instruction from God. In addition to more laws and practices, there are detailed instructions for an ark, a table for the holy bread, a seven-branched golden lampstand, a tabernacle of the tent of meeting, an altar and a sacred area surrounding it, and information about priestly practices and vestments.

The people are camped near Mount Sinai while Moses has gone with his assistant Joshua to meet with God. Moses has left his brother Aaron and nephew Hur in charge of the camp. Moses and Joshua are gone for 40 days and 40 nights — a biblical number symbolic of birth, rebirth, and change. While they are away, the people get restless and make demands on Aaron. They seek assurance of God's presence, but in the form of idols from nature-religions of the ancient Near East, with which they would have been familiar and comfortable. The golden calf was an image of strength and virility, common in religions of that area — it was meant to soothe their troubled hearts.

### **Lectionary Readings**

Sun 15 Psalm 106:1-6, 19-23\* Matthew 22:15-22\* Mon 16 Exodus 33:12-23\* 21 Isaiah 45:1-7 Sat Exodus 34:1-10 22 Psalm 96:1-9 17 Sun Tue Psalm 99\* \* Denotes Sunday lectionary readings) Wed 18 19 Thu 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10\*

Moses returns from the mountain to the camp with clear divine instruction about how the gold brought from Egypt (Exodus 11:2) is to be used, only to find that it has been moulded into an idol of another religion. Four things become clear as a result of the encounter with God that follows. First, God pays attention: God is frustrated with the behaviour of these

chosen people, calling them perverse, stiff-necked, and disobedient. Second, God is being changed: it's clear from the interaction with Moses that God can be influenced. Third, God seeks relationship: Moses is remembered as the prophetic leader who had a direct and dynamic relationship with God. They argue, they commiserate, they cajole, they rant, and



they care. A healthy relationship with the Holy can include all that and much more. Fourth, God loves: perhaps God's anger, judgment, and repentance are all grounded in the reality that the creation is beloved of God.

In **Psalm 106:1–6, 19–23,** the poet remembers the incident with the golden calf in this communal lament, which acknowledges the movement between human disobedience and God's mercy.


That same dance is highlighted in **Matthew 22:1–14** between the invited wedding guests and the host. It matters to God not only how we participate, but also that we choose to participate in the Kin-dom.

Paul is clear that there is nothing as desirable as participation in the realm of God. In **Philippians 4:1–9**, he opens a window into what this looks like: don't worry about anything; let your gentleness be known; and let God know your requests. Finally, let truth, integrity, justice, and gracious living be your practice.

In a progressively instant society, it can be hard to wait for and trust in God's steadfastness, while so many other things fight for our time promising instant satisfaction. Moses reminds us that building a strong relationship takes time, trust, and perhaps a little heartache. How is your relationship with God? What is competing for your time in worship and prayer?
