

Seasons of the Spirit

Our Whole Selves

Focus scripture

Exodus 33:12-23, Psalm 99, 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10, Matthew 22:15-22

Praver

Draw closer to us, God our Creator, for sometimes in our desire to be accepted and loved, we try to be someone else; forgetting that we are wholly loved and uniquely made. Amen.

It can be very scary to share our whole selves with people; we may fear that parts of ourselves will not be loveable to those about whom we care. But to be in an authentic relationship, we must be our authentic selves. God shows Moses a glimpse of God's true glory and reminds us all that we are known and loved by the Holy Mystery for who we truly are.

Focus scripture: Exodus 33:12-23

After the golden calf incident (Exodus 32:1-14), Moses smashed the tablets (on which the covenant was written), argued with Aaron, castigated the people, and continued to plead the Israelites' case with God. God is not happy. The people of Israel, rescued from Egypt and on their way to a new land and new life, build a golden calf idol. God instructs Moses to continue the journey and lead the people of Israel to the new land, but the people mourn when they hear God has decreed not to go with them.

Against this background, Moses now proceeds to intercede with God on behalf of the people. Moses pitches his tent outside the camp, and God speaks with him "face to face." How many ministers, church leaders, and individuals can resonate with aspects of this conversation?

Moses to God: You've given me this job but who is going to help me? Do you expect me to do it alone? You said that you know me and that I'm okay. So show me what to do, so I know I'm okay and don't forget the people (your people) who are following me.

God to Moses: "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest" (v. 14). (Is God as presence metaphysical, mystery, or both? Is the "rest" a physical rest or something else?)

Moses to God: It's not enough, I need to know you are going with the people. If we do not experience your presence, then we will not move forward. How else will I/we know that we are special to you?

God to Moses: "I will do the very thing that you have asked" (v. 17).

Is Moses satisfied? No. Moses now wants to see the glory of God; but what would he see? God is creator, not an element of the creation and, therefore, cannot be seen by another created element (the human). God cannot be seen in the context of our spatial or temporal reality. In fact, we can only see the results of God's presence and actions, not a being called God.

Following this exchange, Moses receives a second I set of covenant tablets and makes preparations to continue the journey to the promised land.

What a change there is by the time of Psalm 99. Here, God is acknowledged as sovereign over the people and the land and described as: "Mighty, lover of justice, you have established equity; you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob" (v. 4). Further, God's actions during the journey through the wilderness are recalled with favour. This psalm of praise to God also includes the praise for three great leaders of Israel: Moses, Aaron, and Samuel.



Paul expresses this relationship with God in 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10 where he affirms and gives thanks for the faith of his friends, stating that the good news, God's convincing word, came through the Holy Spirit – another example of the power of the presence of God.

As a contrast, Matthew 22:15-22 tells the story of discerning taxes, where the stamping of Caesar on the coinage settles the question – "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's and unto God the things that are God's" (v. 21). While this can be seen as an example of the separation of church and state it also harkens back to the wilderness experiences of discerning and following God's guiding presence.

We are reminded this week of the importance of being our whole selves in our relationships. Moses attempts to experience God as he understands the Creator, but God is bigger than what we can perceive. And yet, God still attempts to be in relationship with us on our level. Relationships are important, and a relationship with God is paramount. What does it mean to be on a journey of friendship with the One who desires to be in loving relationship with us? Perhaps the transparency of Moses' relationship with God can help to model the relationships we attempt to build with each other.

As God's people grow older they learn things along the way. Ask some of the older people at church if they have a little bit of wisdom to help you live with God at the centre of your life.


