I needed Lynn to help me see the potential within that vase.... to see what it does for the flowers, rather than how it looks by itself. God and my church family help me to see the potential within the


people around me. They show me the hidden depths of people, and their potential. Instead of "writing people off", I can try to

¹⁷ As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him. "Good teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

¹⁸ "Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone.
